Going Forward

Our church will open for public Mass from Monday 29th June. The health and safety of all our parishioners is paramount and we will be adhering to current Public Health guidelines regarding social distancing and sanitisation.

The following is our short term plan until such time as we can fully go back to normal.

- Monday to Friday Mass will be at 10am
- Saturday Vigil Mass—7pm (No morning Mass)
- Sunday Mass at 10.30, 12 and 7pm (No 9am Mass)

• The church and the extension will have reduced capacity - 75 places (1 place can be an individual, a couple or possibly a household unit). This may change as new guidelines are issued. Seating will be clearly marked.

• The dispensation from the Sunday/Holy Day obligation is extended for the time being, you might consider attending on a week-day instead. (We anticipate those who are vulnerable or unwell, especially those with any symptoms indicating Covid 19 infection, will stay at home and if possible, participate, as now, via webcam, TV, radio etc.)

To enable us to open the church safely, we need help from parishioners, sanitising the church after Masses and guiding other parishioners to safe seating. This will involve coming to Mass a little earlier and/or remaining for about 10/15 minutes after Mass. A number of parishioners have already volunteered, <u>but we need more</u>. We welcome any help you can give. Please leave your name with Máirín (01 8115414) or Christine (01 8115412).

Thank you for your prayers and support throughout these past few months, may we face the future with renewed hope building on the generous spirit that is evident in the community.


