Current Arrangements

- Monday to Friday Mass at **10am**—the church will open at 9.30am and close at 3pm for sanitisation
- Saturday Vigil Mass—**7pm** (No morning Mass)
- Sunday Mass at **10.30, 12 & 7pm** (No 9am Mass) Church will be close for sanitisation after each Mass

The church and the extension will have reduced capacity – a maximum of 50 people may gather in both the church and the extension. Seating is clearly marked.

Some advice for returning to Mass at this time

- No obligation to attend Sunday Mass —you might consider attending on a week-day instead.
- Our experience of Mass will be different for many months yet —We anticipate those who are unwell or vulnerable, especially those with any symptoms indicating Covid 19 infection, will continue to parti cipate at home, as now, via webcam, TV, radio etc.)
- Do your best not to block the doors entering and leaving. Please respect physical distancing both inside and outside the church.
- Sanitize your hands on entry—we encourage you to wear a mask.
- Please cooperate with volunteer stewards while entering, exiting and receiving Holy Communion
- Please leave patiently and promptly after Mass. Please be aware of physical distance when lighting candles. It might be preferable to light them on private visits to the Church. Remember—hand sanitiser can be flammable, so ensure your hands are completely dry.


