The Seven Last Words of Christ on the Cross

<u>Introduction</u>



The Apostles' Creed is our fundamental Baptismal symbol of faith. We can draw strength from the power of this Creed to live more deeply the faith into which we were baptised and which we renew at Easter. During Lent and Holy Week certain parts of what we believe come into

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. On the

third day He rose again from the dead. This set of reflections on the 'Seven Last Words of Christ on the Cross' are taken from 'Seven Last Words' by Fr. Timothy Radcliffe OP and are an attempt to open a door into a safe place of hope where we can reflect on our faith in a time of crisis and suffering. There we hope to encounter Jesus who understands pain, loss and struggle.

1. Forgive them for they know not what they do. (Luke 23:34)



Reflection The first word given to us today is forgiveness. Forgiveness comes before the crucifixion, before the insults and the death. Forgiveness is always first. Maybe we could not cope with listening to the passion of Christ if we did not begin with forgiveness. Before we ever sin, we are forgiven. We do not have to earn it. We do not even have to be sorry. Forgiveness is there, waiting for us. Forgiveness is not God forgetting Good Friday. It is the Father raising the Son on Easter Sunday.

Reflection John McAreavey whose wife of 12 days, Michaela, was murdered in Mauritius while on their honeymoon in 2011 was asked if he forgave her killers.

He said - 'Nothing is impossible. Being Catholic and trying to follow the example we're set ... forgiveness is a big part of it'.

Silent Prayer

Let us pray,

God of love and mercy, Renew my faith in the forgiveness of sins so that I will: Accept your gift of compassion.

Turn away from thoughts of hatred and revenge

Share the grace of mercy with others.

We ask this in the Spirit of peace and through your gentle Son, Jesus Christ.

As I was saving to one of the Sacristans - Feb 1st (St. Brigid), Feb 2nd (Candlemas) and Feb 3rd (St Blaise) are like a mini Triduum and then you have the St Brigid's Bank Holiday which this year stretched the occasion to 5 days. Each of the Celebrations had its own unique character and each was a wonderful occasion. A huge amount of work went on in the background involving the Sacristans, Liturgy Team, Hospitality Team and the Parish Office Thank you all!

Intercessions for Vocations Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time - St Paul in his letter to the Church community in Corinth tells them that he takes Christ as his model. We pray for those discerning a vocation, that they will always strive to model their lives on Jesus, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Ash Wednesday – 14th February

Next Wednesday 14th February is Ash Wednesday a day of fast and abstinence and the beginning of the Season of Lent. Why do we put ash on our forehead? - Ashes are applied to our forehead in the sign of the cross as the words, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return" are spoken to us. The other formula which is used, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" emphasises our call to continual conversion and holiness of life. This act symbolizes our mortality as well as our need for ongoing repentance. It is a reminder that this life is short and merely a foreshadowing of what we shall become through the redemption of Jesus Christ on the cross. The work of our redemption will not be complete until we are raised from the dead, in resurrected bodies like His own and called to the eternal communion of heaven.


