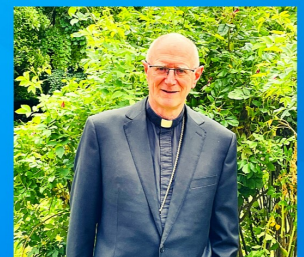
All of the submissions will be read and a summary given to Archbishop Farrell to take forward.

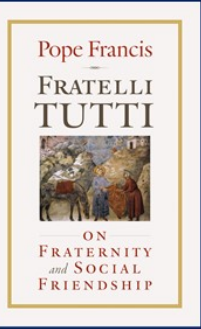
