You are not Rubbish!

It is a while ago now, but on Wednesday February 1st the Parish celebrated our Parish Feast Day of St Brigid. With the new Public Holiday also called St Brigid's day falling this year on Monday February 6th we were blessed with a long celebration, especially as we highlighted the Feast Day from the weekend

Anyway back to the day itself. Bishop Eamonn Walsh presided at the Mass and it was lovely of him to do so. The Mass began with a St Brigid's Procession. Blan Flanagan carried St Brigid's lamp followed by Mary Ronayne with the thurible and incense. Mary Tighe carried St Brigid's Cross, Deacon Michael O' Connor, the Book of the Gospels followed by myself and the Bishop, During this Opening Procession the three piece music group of Mary Kelly, Frances Timmins and Mairin Keegan (PPW) sang St Brigid's song. They provided the music and singing for the liturgy and they made a beautiful sound. After incensing the altar the Bishop greeted all present especially the school children. The main body of the Church was comfortably full with a small overflow in the extension. The children and their teachers were present from our three Parish Schools – Scoil Bhride, St Francis Xavier and Scoil Oilbhear.

When it came to the reading Maire Martin proclaimed God's Word and Deacon Michael the Gospel. The Bishop's homily was interesting, prayerful and thought provoking. By now you may have asked yourself the question and now forgotten that you have asked it. Why have I titled the newsletter, 'You are not rubbish'. In his homily which was addressed to everyone but the Bishop speaking directly to the school children seated in the front of the Church said, 'Rushes are usually a sign of boggy land and by and large are cut down and cleared away. But as we know there is no need to throw them in a compost heap as rushes can be used for making beautiful things such as St Brigid's crosses'. Drawing on that point he went on to say that 'nothing is rubbish, rather everything is of value and therefore no human being should ever view themselves or be viewed by others as rubbish. To God everything is good'. Addressing all of us and in particular the school children he said, 'You are not rubbish!' Next followed the Prayers of the Faithful which were read by our Parish Secretary Jean Rogers.

After the Liturgy of the Word we moved on to the Offertory Procession and the Bread and Wine were presented to the Bishop by Maureen Fleming and Patricia Cullen. Along with the Bishop and Deacon Michael the Ministers of the Eucharist were Dolores O' Leary and Mary Ronayne (Both of whom were the Sacristan's for the day) and Mary

Towards the end of the Mass the Bishop blessed all the St Brigid's crosses especially those of the children all of whom brought crosses that they made at school. Before the final blessing I thanked Bishop Eamonn for presiding at a beautiful Mass (which it was) and Christine Carleton presented to the Bishop on behalf of the Parish a beautifully framed St Brigid's Cross. Outside, the Bishop greeted all who were leaving the Church...wait we are still not finished! There was a beautiful reception in the Pastoral Centre hosted by the Parish Hospitality Team. The centre looked magnificent and the cakes delicious. As the reception was going on Mary Tighe held a St Brigid's Cross workshop in the Fr Dungan Room. There are now a huge number of parishioners who are able to make their own St Brigid's Cross. Over the 10 days or so from 28th January until February 6th we have done St Brigid proud in 2023.
