Let us pray: Lord, May this candle be a light for you to build warmth in our hearts for those who live in poverty and fear. Amen.

North, Central and South America The world's highest waterfall is in Venezuela, which is in South America. It is called the Santo del Ángel. Brazil is also in South America and is the fifth largest country in the world! Sadly, over forty million children live and work on the streets of South America and have no homes to go to. What do you value most about your home? How could you share more so that other children can have the same? When praying today, remember the girls and boys in North, Central and South America who wander the streets looking for shelter and safety and families that will love and care for them.

We Pray Loving God, whose son Jesus Christ said, 'Let the children come to me; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these', protect children living on the streets from the harm that could befall them. Comfort those trapped in bonded labour, abuse and homelessness, and bring healing to each of them. Although we may sometimes take our own shelter and security for granted, we commit to value and care for this gift better. We pray for the courage to condemn the causes of homelessness and to offer material sup-

port for those in need. Amen. Our Mission Prayer Lord, May all children in

the world share love, share friendship and live in the peace of your love. Now and forever, Amen.

Synod on Synodality 4th-29th October

Today's readings offer us more insight and wisdom of the call to synodality, which is currently being discerned at the Universal Synod in Rome. In writing to the early church in Philippi, Paul reminds them, not only of his own situation, but of his call to 'servant leadership'. This service is modelled on that of Jesus himself, who came not to be served but to serve. Paul's 'servant' style of leadership encourages the members of that early church community to give freely and generously. This Christian way of living is often countercultural. The Synod Working Document also says 'The radical call is, therefore, to build together, synodally, an attractive and grounded Church: an outgoing Church, in which all feel welcome'.

We hear this invitation echoed in the parable Jesus tells of the wedding feast (taking up the imagery from Isaiah). Those who are initially invited refuse to come. Many find excuses while some have a more violent reaction, making their response very clear. However, the King is not put off by this. The invitation is taken out, to the crossroads, to all - and receives a better response. As a synodal Church, walking together is an inclusive action. We are called to examine our own response to this call of synodality and to journey to the crossroads to call and invite. Yet our response has to be one of active participation we have to be ready like those who attended 'dressed in a wedding garment'.

October - Mission Month What is World Mission Sunday?

In basic terms, World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual direct appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of missionaries can continue. It always falls over the second last weekend in October, and similar to the Good Friday Collection fo the Holy Land and Peter's Pence, it is one of three yearly Universal Church collections. Since its announcement as a papal collection, all parishes worldwide have offered Mass collections from the day to aid the work of mission aries and mission overseas. Many are surprised to know that World Mission Sunday collections take place in every single parish where the Church is present. This includes not only Ireland and across Europe, but also in poorer parishes in the developing world. This is why it is such a special and vital celebration.

Saints in the Church's Calendar St. Margaret Mary Alacoque -Monday 16th Oct. 1647-90. She joined the Order of the Visitation at Paray-le-Monial.

St. Ignatius of Antioch, bishop and martyr – Tuesday 17th October. Martyred in Rome (possibly at the Colosseum) about 107AD. He urged Christians to unity in and through the Eucharist.

St. Luke, Evangelist – Wednesday **18th October**. He was a physician from a Gentile Christian milieu. Patron of butchers, bookbinders, doctors, surgeons and artists.

October – the Month of Mission Collection

Next weekend Saturday 21st/Sunday 22nd is October is World Mission Sunday. There will be a special collection at Mass replacing the usual Share collection. "Today vast numbers of people still do not know Jesus Christ. For this reason, the mission continues to be most urgent. All the members of the Church are called to participate in this mission, for the Church is missionary by her very nature: she was born 'to go forth'" – Pope Francis. **Theme** - This year's Mission Sunday theme is inspired by the story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus in the Gospel of St Luke (Lk 24:13-35 "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move") Every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ. The Church. the community of Christ's disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ. Each baptised person is called to mission, in the Church and by the mandate of the Church.
