CHRISTMAS TREE - A Sign and Reminder of Divine Light

"God became man and came among us to dispel the shadows of sin, bringing His divine light to humanity. Important Note

1. The Church can accommodate 220 people (100 Church and 120 Extension) for each Mass on December 24th & 25th. With 5 Christmas Masses (two on the evening and three on the day) we can accommodate 1100 people.
2. A steward will place a cord across each door when limits are reached - this is to comply with Coved regulations and to keep everyone safe. The Government has expressly forbidden people standing in the Church
3. In the Church, Christmas is celebrated over an Octave that is 8 days, so if you would like to attend a 'Christmas Mass' you don't have to confine yourself to December 24th (Vigil) or December 25th, you can attend a Christmas Mass any day up to and including January 1st.

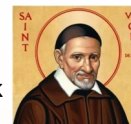
