Synod

The preparatory work in St Brigid's is gathering apace with the first gathering to be held in less than 10 days on Tuesday March 1st. So again a reminder: **What is a Synod** – It is a **council of a church**, usually convened to decide an issue of doctrine, administration or application. The word synod comes from the Greek meaning "assembly" or "meeting" and is analogous with the Latin word concilium meaning "council". Regarding the upcoming Synod in Rome in 2023 every parish in the entire Catholic Church throughout the world is invited to participate so that *"By walking together, and together reflecting on the journey made, the Church will be able to learn from what it will experience which processes can help it to live communion, to achieve participation, to open itself to mission."*

Exploring Priesthood – Zoom with Seminarians and Priests

On Tuesday 1st March @ 8pm there will be an opportunity for young men to join in on a Zoom to find out more about priesthood and to hear directly from two young men who are currently studying for the priesthood in our National Seminary in Maynooth. The event is being run by the National Vocations Office. The key elements of the event which runs for about 90mins, will comprise: Some short YouTube videos on priesthood and vocation, Testimony and vocation story from a priest, Testimony and vocation story from two seminarians as well as an opportunity for Q&A with the seminarians and panel.

Continuing Covid Protective Measures

The Archbishop has requested that the following protective measures remain in place to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the vulnerable or anxious members of the congregation. The archbishop will review towards the end of March

- The wearing of face coverings inside Church buildings;
- Good sanitising and cleaning arrangements;
- Suspension of a handshake as the Sign of Peace
- Holy Communion to be received in the hand
- Holy water to be used in asperges but not yet restored to fountains for communal use at the entrances to Church buildings

How many "kind" words can you find? A new word begins with the last letter of the one before it...

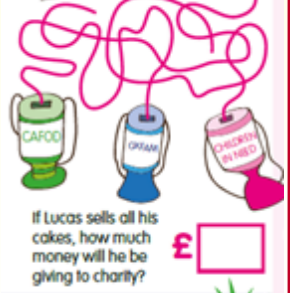


A Prayer to Say Dear Jesus,
