The Church-24 Survey

Since 2020 the Catholic Church has conducted two surveys on churchgoing during Covid-19. The data showed how people reacted to issues such as the closure of the Church buildings, online worship and the stress of ministering with the new changes. Results were reported over many months in journals and religious press. Now in 2024 we seek to update our understanding on the same topics. As with previous surveys, Church-24 invites you to reflect on the big questions and relate your experiences of church life since the pandemic. It should take 15-20 minutes. This survey is for all people, you don't have to be a regular churchgoer to take part.
