CURRENT SCHEDULE been instructing his disciples, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday men and women, throughout his life, not only in Mass at 10am preceded by the Rosary at public (Mt.13:24) but in private (Jn. 13:36). What is really happening at the Ascension? Well Jesus is returning to the Father. He has completed his mission and his Father is taking him home. It is a most intimate meeting: "Well done good and faithful servant....enter into the joy of the Lord". In our prayer we can ask that we might enter the atmosphere of the Ascension. We should try and be joyful for them. We need to be filled with wonder and awe at what is taking place. Two of the gifts of the Holy Spirit are reverence and wonder and awe in the presence of God. As we lead up to the Feast of Pentecost next week why not pray about those two gifts and try and imagine or enter into the Joy of God, the joy of the Trinity at the Ascension. For the Gospel tells us that the disciples worshipped Jesus "and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually praising God". They are starting their journey back to their Father in the same atmosphere, peace and joy, as the gospel began, although it is now Christianised. St. Matthew puts it another way: at the conception, Joseph is told Jesus' name will be 'Emmanuel' that is, God-with-us (Mt.28-20), when he tells his friends, 'I am with you always to the end of time.' The gospel tells us how the human expression of God the Father, Jesus, did this and actually fulfilled himself and enabled us to become his brothers and sisters (Jn.20:17b). Perhaps it is due to that that there doesn't seem to be any nostalgia for the 'good old days' with
