Reflection

The deepest loves are the loves which say 'forever', as in marriage and many other relationships. Jesus in the gospel today is saying that his gift is forever. His love shown in death and resurrection is for all time, for all of us. This can be said to be the meaning of the Eucharist.

Each time we take part in the Mass we are 'present' at the death and resurrection of the Lord. Mass is not just a social gathering, or an ordinary prayer meeting. It is the highest point of Christian prayer, as we join in this love of God in Jesus, given for all time.

This gift of love is received or rejected. Jesus was in a way testing his disciples by asking them 'will you too go away?' knowing that they would stay even though there would be unfaithfulness and one would leave him. They would find out that staying with him would mean trying to share and live out love like he did.

The 'Holy One of God' is the One who loves all God's people to the end. Our Mass is also our thanks to God for this love and for God's call to be part of this love, sharing in his death and resurrection.



Children's Corner


