

Oceania

Oceania's winter is in June, July, and August. The Great Barrier Reef, in Australia, is the world's largest coral reef system. The Solomon Islands is also found there. It has more than nine hundred islands and 90 per cent of the world's earthquakes happen there. In the last ten years children have experienced cyclones, floods, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and tsunamis, which destroy food sources and end livelihoods. What other natural disasters might affect children throughout the world? How can you help them? When praying today, remember the children of Oceania who have lost loved ones, their homes and their family live- Church. The new lists will be placed in lihoods through natural disasters.

Saints in the Church's Calendar

St. John Paul II, - Sunday 22nd October Born Karol Josef Wojtyla in Wadowice, Poland May 18th 1920. He was ordained a priest in 1946 and became a bishop in 1958. He was appointed Archbishop of Krakow in 1964 and made a Cardinal in 1967. He was elected first non-Italian Pope in over 450 years in 1978. He visited Ireland from 29th September to 2nd October 1979. He died in 2005 and was beatified, thereby becoming Blessed in 2011. On 27th April he was canonised Saint. His feast day is observed on the anniversary of the inauguration of his ministry as Universal Pastor of the Church on 22nd October 1978. – not celebrated as it falls on a Sunday.

SS. Simon and Jude, Apostles - Saturday **28th October** St Simon (1st century) is usually called 'the Canaanite' and 'the Zealot'. Suggesting he belonged to the Jewish party of the 'Zealous of the law'. St. Jude or Thaddeus (1st century) has a short epistle in the New Testament ascribed to him, and is popularly invoked as the patron of hopeless causes. Tradition says that after Pentecost they evangelized, Simon in Egypt, Jude in Mesopotamia, and then together in Persia, where they were martyred. Their names appear in the Roman Canon.



Croi Mhaire Foodbank is based in St Ciaran's Church in Hartstown and covers all of Dublin 15. They work in partnership with St Vincent de Paul, and alongside the Blanchardstown Centre for Independent Living and Empower. Croi Mhaire currently delivers food parcels to 65-70 households every two weeks. The number continues to rise weekly. This is the type of non-perishable food items that are suitable: Cereal, porridge, pasta, rice, noodles, soup, tinned fish such as tuna/salmon, tinned vegsuch as beans, peas, sweetcorn and carrots, biscuits, crackers, miwadi, cereal bars, rice cakes, chocolate spread or food suitable for school lunch, jam, marmalade, pasta sauces, sauces for meals (curry, sweet and sour and stir fry), tinned fruit, custard, creamed rice and ..chocolate and crisps
