Thank you from Máirín

So for those of you who haven't heard I'm retiring on Sunday the 25th of June and before I go I would like to say thank you to the community of faith in Saint Brigid's parish Blanchardstown.

I was appointed by the Archbishop to Saint Brigid's in September 2017 and was told by Kevin, my predecessor, that I was lucky to get Blanch! Fr. Dermot Clarke was my initial boss in Aughrim Street and he had told me all about his time in Blanchardstown, so before I ever arrived I was hearing good things. From the first meeting with Fr. Cyril, I was made welcome and as I got to know the community of faith more, I realised that I was going to be working in a parish where the parishioners took responsibility for the running of the parish; from the Cleaning team, Collecting& Counting teams, Hospitality team, Prayer group, Meditation group, Adoration team, Baptism team, Confirmation team, Liturgy team, Child protection, Readers, Eucharistic ministers, Parish pastoral council. The Finance committee and the Junior and Senior choirs. So impressive! We now also have a Teen Hope team, a Communications Team, a Property and Finance team, a Family Mass team, a Liturgy of the Word team, a Sacristans team, a Laudato Si team, a Royal Canal team, an Adult Faith group and a Lectio Divina group.

This was and is an active living parish with room for everyone. I got to know the parishioners bit by bit (I can't mention everyone by name but each one of you supported me and encouraged me both personally and in my ministry) and we all worked together with the parish team to build up the community of faith. Christine took me under her wing and supported anything I tried to do with generosity and good humour (which was needed!). We now have Jean on board and it's as if she was always here, both Jean and Christine are always ready to listen and give a hand even in the middle of their busyness.

We all remember March 2020 when we were told to stay at home and to keep one another safe. This was such a challenging time for the Church and for all of us personally. When we reopened it was like a military campaign! Measuring out the seats, making sure we had stewards for the different Masses and keeping everywhere sanitised. None of this would have been possible without the generous support that you gave and once again it showed that in this parish people are willing to walk the walk and do the work necessary. We lost some good friends during Covid and we weren't able to say goodbye as we would have liked, they are still missed and remembered with love.

Fr Michael was appointed to our parish in September 2021 and was welcomed as everyone who comes to work here is welcomed, with a wonderful accepting and helpful welcome. I have been blessed to work with priests, sisters and deacons who support me as lay woman in my role. It has been wonderful to be involved in planning with the different parish groups and teams

and to share our vison of how the Church can grow as we go forward, especially in our parish Assembly, and the Synod and Building Hope gatherings. Our Church is changing but it is also alive and active in a new way and I am full of hope for the future even though I don't know what that future will be, it's in God's hands. I'll finish with a quote from Paul's letter to the Philippians.

"Every time I think of you, I thank my God. And whenever I mention you in my prayers, it makes me happy. . . You have a special place in my heart.

Thank you all for sharing the precious gift of your lives and your faith with me.

Saints in the Church's Calendar

Ss. Peter and Paul, Apostles - Thurs 29th, On the day traditionally considered by pagan Rome to be its foundation day by Romulus, we celebrate the twin founders of the Church in Rome. St. Peter died by crucifixion and St. Paul by beheading between 64-67. Peter was a fisherman, eventually chosen as the leader of the Twelve, the 'rock' on which the Church was built. Paul, a tentmaker from Tarsus, a Pharisee and a Roman citizen was a persecutor of the first Christians but was converted by the Lord on his way to Damascus. He became the Apostle of the Gentiles. But they were chosen to become the pillars of our faith, which they sealed with their martyrdom in Rome.

A Reflective Sentence

God stretched out his hands on the Cross so as to embrace the farthest corners of the universe - St. Cyril of Jerusalem (313 - 386/387, Father of the Church).


It will be hard to fill John's shoes and finding a new Choir Director is not proving to be easy...please pray for a new director.
