Synod Logo A sincere thank you to Mary Ronayne and Delores O'Leary our resident liturgical artists who created the beautiful Diocesan Synod Logo in front of the altar. The gold threads are a particular feature. The meaning of the Logo itself is as follows:


The lighthouse represents the guiding light of the Holy Spirit who guides us on our synodal path.

The **boat** represents the Church, we are all in the same boat together. The water represents the waters of baptism, sustaining us on our way.

Ash Wednesday – 2nd March is a day of fast and abstinence and the beginning of the Season of Lent.

Why do we put ash on our forehead? - Ashes are applied to our forehead in the sign of the cross as the words, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return" are spoken to us. The other formula which is used, "Turn away All available on www.blanchardstownparish.ie/webcam from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" emphasizes our call to continual conversion and holiness of life. This act symbolises our mortality as well as our need for ongoing repentance. It is a reminder that this life is short and merely a foreshadowing of what we shall become through the redemption of Jesus Christ on the cross. The work of our redemption will not be complete until we are raised from the dead, in resurrected bodies like His own and called to the eternal communion of heaven. Fr Michael Carey PP


Trocaire

Lent is synonymous with Trocaire or is it the other way around! The Trociare boxes are available in the Church along with included information. Please take a box home - it can be quite amazing how much loose change can amount to.

Trócaire was established in 1973 as the overseas development agency of the Catholic Church in Ireland. The organisation was created as a response to the widening gap between rich and poor and our collective duty to reduce it. Trócaire's work is rooted in Catholic social teaching, based on the belief that God has a plan for creation, a plan to build his kingdom of peace, love and justice.

Food Shortage and Scarcity – Courage, Hope and Strength Needed

This Lent, we hear about how communities who were already facing huge challenges due to drought and food shortages, caused by climate change, were further impacted by Covid-19. 
