Going Forward

We are happy to open our church for public Mass from Monday 29th June while adhering to current Public Health guidelines.

THE FOLLOWING IS OUR SHORT TERM PLAN UNTIL WE GO BACK TO NORMAL.

- Monday to Friday Mass will be at **10am** the church will open at 9.30am and close at 3pm for sanitisation
- Saturday Vigil Mass—7pm (No morning Mass)

Sunday – Mass at 10.30, 12 & 7pm (No 9am Mass)
Church will be closed & sanitised after each Mass

The church and the extension will have reduced capacity – <u>under current health guidelines only 50</u> people may gather in the church for Mass (this may change). Seating will be clearly marked.

Some advice for returning to Mass:

The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is suspended—you might consider attending on a week-day instead.

- Our experience of Mass will be different for many months yet —We anticipate those who are vulnerable or unwell, especially those with any symptoms indicating Covid 19 infection, will continue to participate at home, as now, via webcam, TV, radio etc.)
- Do your best not to block the doors entering and leaving. Please respect physical distancing both inside and outside the church.
- Sanitize your hands on entry—masks are recommended.
- Please cooperate with volunteer stewards.
- Please follow directions for receiving Holy Communion
- Please leave patiently and promptly after Mass.
- Please be aware of physical distance when lighting candles. It might be preferable to light them on private visits to the Church. Remember—hand sanitiser can be flammable, so ensure your hands are completely dry.

Thank you for your prayers and support throughout these past few months; with your generous spirit of patience and cooperation we can move forward with renewed hope and return to the richness of celebrating Eucharist and the sacraments.

If you have already volunteered to help, but have not been contacted, please remind us and we will get in touch. All help is welcome.
