For Jesus the beatitudes are about a new way of living. For the Lord it is not what we have but who we are, how we live and how we relate to others that leads to ultimate satisfaction. Real happiness lies in the gift of blessedness that only God gives.

 Blest are the poor in spirit: those who real ize their utter need of God and the poverty of life without him

• Blest are those who mourn: those who grieve over the state of the world, their sins and the sins of others

Blest are the meek and lowly: those who realize their place before God and don't try to impose their will on him

Blest are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness: those who yearn for God's way of doing things to become the norm of human conduct and act accordingly.

• Blest are the merciful: those who forgive as God forgives and who do not hold grudges or seek revenge

• Blest are the clean of heart: those who act from the purest motives of love for God alone and single-heartedly seek to do his will

Blest are the peacemakers: those who are reconciled with God themselves, and others and help others to enjoy the same peace

• Blest are the persecuted for the sake of Jesus: those who suffer or are

Saints in the Church's Calendar

Bl. Margaret Ball and Francis Taylor, martyrs - Monday 30th January

BI Margaret Ball was imprisoned for teaching Catholicism, harbouring priests and having Mass celebrated in her home. Bl. Francis Taylor was born in Swords in 1550. He was elected Dublin's mayor in 1595. Later he was imprisoned for his Catholic faith, and died on 29 January 1621.

St. Brigid, Abbess, Secondary Patron of Ireland- Wednesday 1st Feb. Known as 'the Mary of the Gael', St Brigid is renowned for her hospitality, almsgiving and care of the sick. She was born c. 454. When she was young her father wished her to marry but she insisted in consecrating her virginity to God. She received the veil and spiritual formation probably from St. Mel and stayed for a period under his direction in Ardagh. Others followed her example and this led her to found a double monastery in Kildare with the assistance of Bishop Conleth. She died in 524 and her cult is widespread throughout Europe. The St. Brigid's Cross, in legend used by Brigid to explain the Christian faith, remains a popular sign of God's protection.

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord-Thurs 2nd Feb, This feast is a remembrance of the Lord and Mary, his Mother, With candles in their hands, the people go out to meet the Lord and to acclaim him with Simeon, who recognized Christ as 'a light to reveal God to the nations'

St Blaise, bishop and martyr -Friday 3rd Feb died 315. Bishop of Sebastes, martyred in Armenia. Tradition states that he was a physician before becoming a bishop. He has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer from disease of the throat.


