Synod on Synodality - 4th - 29th Oct This weekend marks the end on the monthlong Synod on Synodality. No doubt it will year. A synodal Church walks together not leaving anyone behind and is alongside those who struggle the most. We can ask ourselves in our parishes how are we building a synodal Church capable of promoting the belonging and participation of the least within the Church and in society? How are we reaching out to those who are different from us to those who are struggling? How are we providing pastoral outreach and care to migrant communities? How are we connecting with the men and women of our time?

The Holy Spirit is moving in all that has happened so far on the synodal pathway and all that is happening now in Rome. We are growing in our awareness that a synodal Church is a listening Church. For many, the great surprise was the experience of being listened to by the community. For some this was a new experience, of receiving recognition of our unique human worth as sons and daughters of God who is love. As we listened attentively to each other's lived experiences, we grew in mutual respect and began to discern the movements of God's Spirit in the lives of others and in our own. By listening carefully, and prayerfully, to one another, and by walking, supportively, together on the synodal pathway, each one of us can draw closer to each other and closer to God. In our listening, each one of us can learn a little bit more about how to love God and how to love our neighbour. This is it helps us to put words on what God is asking of us and begin to name practical

people's lives especially to those in most need.
