Some advice for returning to Mass:

- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is suspended—you might consider a week-day instead.
- Do your best not to block the doors entering & leaving.
- Sanitize your hands on entry—masks are obligatory.
- Please cooperate with volunteer stewards.
- Please follow directions for receiving Holy Communion
- Please leave patiently and promptly after Mass.
(The Rosary will be said before Mass—9.35am.)
- Please be aware of physical distance at all times.
- Remember—hand sanitiser can be flammable— ensure your hands are completely dry before lighting candles.




TELL THE WORLD
