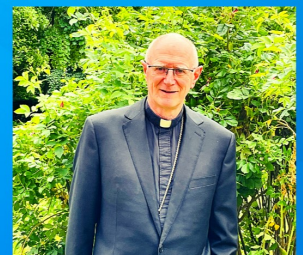
All of the submissions will be read and a summary given to Archbishop Farrell to take forward.

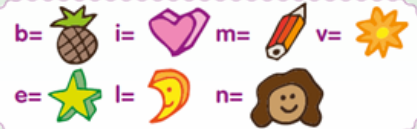

Jesus was amazed that the people did not have faith.

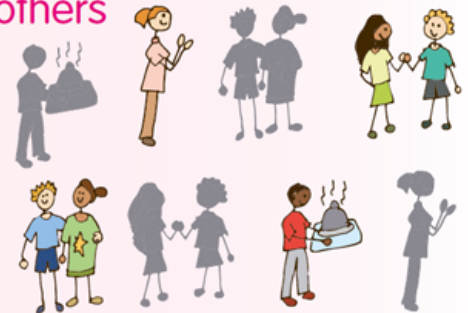


Decode the words to hear what Jesus wants.
