### Saints in the Church's Calendar

Tuesday 8th: St Josephine Bakhita 1868-1947 a native of Sudan, brought as a slave to Italy where she became a Christian and entered the Daughters of Charity in Venice. Thursday 10th: St. Scholastica died c.543 was a sister of St Benedict. When she met her brother for the last time. a sudden rainstorm providentially prolonged the meeting; three days later St. Benedict saw her soul ascend to heaven as a dove (her symbol in art).

Friday 11th: Our Lady of Lourdes On this day in 1858, Our Lady first appeared to the 14 yr. old Bernadette Soubirous. The last of apparition was on 16 July 1858.

Catholic Schools: Living Life to the Full A fortnight ago the Church in Ireland celebrated catholic Schools Week (CSW) 2022. There was a lot on in our Parish so I didn't get time to mention it but am doing so now.

Catholic Schools Week 2022 began on Sunday, 23 January, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, and its theme is 'Catholic Schools: Living Life to the Full'. February 8th is International Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human *Trafficking*, first observed in 2015 and on the memorial of St. Josephine Bakhita. Each year, around 2.5 million people are victims of trafficking and slavery. For those engaged in trafficking it has become one of the most lucrative illegal activities in the world. Through the Day of Prayer, we reflect on the experience of those who have suffered but also we are called to reach out to victims and survivors.
