1st: Acts of the Apostles 10: 25-26, 34-35, 44-48

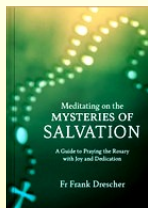

The Path Ahead

We are delighted to reopen for public Mass from Monday 10th May. Government guidelines allow for a **maximum of 50 persons in each section of the church (total of 100)** for Mass with strict social distancing and sanitising practices in place.

Monday to Friday Mass 10.00am (the Rosary will be said before Mass to facilitate sanitising)

The church will open at 9.30am and close at 3pm for sanitising

Saturday Vigil Mass at 7.00pm (no morning Mass)

Sunday Mass at 10.30am* and 12 noon

Some advice for returning to Mass:

Our experience of Mass will be different for some time yet.

- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is suspended—due to limited numbers, you might consider attending on a week-day instead.
- Do your best not to block the doors entering & leaving.
- Sanitize your hands on entry—masks are obligatory.
- Please cooperate with volunteer stewards.
- Please follow directions for receiving Holy Communion
- Please leave patiently and promptly after Mass.
(The Rosary will be said before Mass—9.45am.)
- Please be aware of physical distance at all times.
- Remember—hand sanitiser can be flammable, so ensure your hands are completely dry before lighting candles.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support throughout this last year; with your generous spirit of patience and cooperation we look forward with renewed hope to returning to the richness of celebrating Eucharist and the sacraments.

Our Parish Project—May, 2021

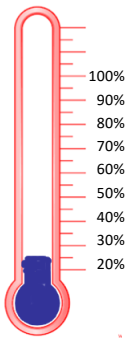
