The Feast of the Annunciation

When we first meet someone and spend time getting to know each other, the tendency is to turn to what we do. We tend to inquire about job, education, family, recreational interests. Seldom do we inquire about who someone is. If we would ask, "Who are you?" we would probably get a blank stare. We tend to self-identify with what is at hand, what is visible, what is easily grasped: what we do, what interests us, what motivates us. Yet, as the relationship grows and deepens, gradually we begin to get a sense of who each other is; honest, trustworthy, faithful, loving, caring. Sometimes, over the years of relationship, we might even begin to get a sense of the other's spiritual depth, grow in appreciation that they are holy. But, most likely, if we would share this with the other, it would be denied. "Me, holy? Oh, no!" So we can readily identify with Mary's response to the angel Gabriel's greeting her as someone who is holy. She was "greatly troubled". Wouldn't we all be?

The annunciation by the angel Gabriel to Mary that she would conceive the "Son of God" unleashed unprecedented events, much more than even the incarnation of the "Son of God". Yes, Mary is troubled, for she is addressed as no other human being before her; she is hailed as one "full of grace". Mary already fully participates in the Life of the One who "will be called holy, the Son of God" through the power of the Holy Spirit. So do we share in that same Life, by that same power by that same Spirit. This is our annunciation day, too.

We are holy because Jesus is holy. We do not earn holiness by doing good deeds, but our good deeds - our care and concern for others – is a concrete expression of our holiness, our relationship with God. We celebrate this day Jesus being made flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit. We also celebrate this day Jesus being made flesh in our own lives by our faithful living of the divine Life that was first given us in baptism and continues to grow in us as we, like Mary, say yes to God in all we do. 2) Ronald Rolheiser, Domestic Monastery It would be good if participants had readpages 7-44 in Gruen's book in preparation of our first session.


Saints in the Church's Calendar

Children's Corner


In the Gospel The owner of the vineyard wants trees with
