



New Year Liturgy Seminar

Come to our liturgy gathering on Saturday 30 January in Clonliffe College (9.30 a.m. - 1.30 p.m.). Meet others involved in liturgy throughout the diocese and attend two workshops of your choice from the five on offer. Registration is at 9.00 a.m. and sessions begin at 9.30 a.m. There is a 20 minute break at 11.00 a.m. and the next session will continue until 12.50 p.m. Then we will go to the church for a Prayer Service which will incorporate elements from all five workshops. **Booking is essential** and forms are included with this newsletter or available in the download section of our website.

Workshops

1. How can I pray with the Jubilee Logo?

Father Damian McNeice will lead people into a prayerful reflection on the logo of the Jubilee of Mercy created by Marko Rupnik S.J. You will take home ideas for praying with small or large groups as you are invited into the prayerful world of image and icon-ography.



2. How can the Parables of Luke still speak to us today?

Father Kieran O'Mahony O.S.A. will open up the treasures of the Parables of Mercy which are a rich source of inspiration for prayer services, scripture study and *lectio divina* groups during the Year of Mercy.

3. How can I rediscover Mercy/Trócaire at this time?

Ms. Hannah Evans will introduce Trócaire's catechetical programme entitled 'Rediscovering Mercy'. This workshop will show how to use this resource with its theme of mercy and how we can express it in our lives. Additional liturgical resources for the Year of Mercy and Lent 2016 will also be provided.

4. How can I celebrate the Jubilee of Mercy in Lent 2016?

Father Pat O'Donoghue will offer ideas for creating an 'oasis of mercy' during Lent which will include music, reflection and nature. Examples of Reconciliation Services which can be used during the '24 Hours for the Lord' campaign on 4/5 March will be shared. He will also look creatively at the corporal and spiritual works of mercy showing how they can be incorporated into a Novena of Grace.

5. How can I continue to Gather for Prayer on weekdays in the absence of an ordained priest?

Ms. Julie Kavanagh will explore in a practical and reflective way the challenge of leading people in prayer on weekdays when Mass cannot be celebrated. Drawing from the recent publication of the National Liturgy Centre – *It Is Good For Us To Be Here* - Julie will introduce the formation material from this resource and the wider context for this discussion.

Jubilee of Mercy

The Jubilee of Mercy continues to offer many opportunities for deepening our understanding of God's mercy and for sharing that grace with others. 60,000 Advent Mercy Packs were distributed in over 130 parishes throughout this diocese and in a few other dioceses who also liked the idea. People were



encouraged to place the logo on a door to let people know that as they crossed their threshold they would experience mercy and compassion. The challenge is to accompany the opening of our 'holy door' with the daily living of the call to be 'merciful like the Father'.

We offer you some more resources in our liturgy seminar for the season of Lent especially in response to the invitation of Pope Francis for every community to celebrate '**24 Hours for the Lord**' on the weekend of **4/5 March**. Sunday **6 March** is the 4th Sunday of Lent and also Mother's Day and the Gospel is the story of the Prodigal. Many parishes celebrate the Novena of Grace from **4-12 March** which could have mercy as the focus this year. This period of Lent could be such a graced and inclusive time as we work together to create 'an oasis of mercy'.

Celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday

The Divine Mercy devotion inspired by Saint Faustina was much loved by Saint John Paul II and placed by him in the calendar of the church on the Sunday after Easter. The scripture readings for that day illustrate various aspects of mercy - the gracious healing of so many by the Apostles is described in Acts 5:12-16, the boundless love of God is celebrated in Psalm 117:2-4.22-27, the seven golden lampstands in Apocalypse 1:12 could represent the seven corporal or spiritual works of mercy while the Gospel story of the sending of the Spirit and the commissioning of the disciples as missionaries of forgiveness in John 20:19-31 completes the selection. The Word of God draws together the various strands of the Divine gift we are celebrating this year and the Collect is addressed to the 'God of everlasting mercy'. The liturgy of the day is rich in 'mercy'. A suitable song is *Christ In Me Arise* (Trevor Thomson) from Emmanuel 2015 which combines resurrection and healing.



Jubilee Resource Books


Eight resource books for the Jubilee of Mercy have been prepared by the Pontifical Council for the New Evangelisation. They are brief and concise resources which are published by Our Sunday Visitor and available in Veritas shops.

1. Celebrating Mercy – pastoral ideas for the celebration of the Jubilee
2. Psalms of Mercy – spiritual, prayerful and scholarly contribution
3. Parables of Mercy – rooted in the grace of mercy
4. Confession: the Sacrament of Mercy – a valuable pastoral resource
5. The Works of Mercy – scriptural roots explored
6. The Saints of Mercy – stories of 27 saints
7. Mercy in the Fathers of the Church – mainly St. Augustine
8. Mercy in the Teaching of Popes – concentration on most recent popes

Catholic Schools Week 2016

Catholic Schools Week will take place from **Sunday 31 January to Saturday 6 February 2016** on the theme "Catholic Schools: Challenged to Proclaim God's Mercy". Catholic Schools Week is an all-Ireland annual event which invites Catholic schools to give expression in a special way to the ethos of Catholic education.



Resources are available from the website of the Irish Bishop's Conference – (www.catholicbishops.ie) The weekend liturgy for the 4th Sunday of the Year (31 January) could be enhanced by using suitable music from the Emmanuel 2016 programme on the theme of mercy such as *Lord, Show Us Your Mercy* (Jeanne Cotter), *Let Your Mercy Wash Over Us* (Trevor Thomson) and *Blessed Are the Merciful* (Jackub Blycharz). It would be great if they could be led by students from the local school who are taking part in the Emmanuel programme. A list of participating schools is on our website in the music section.

Day for Consecrated Life

The Year of Consecrated Life will conclude throughout the world on **2 February** – the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. The Dublin celebration will take place in the Church of Saint Therese, **Mount Merrion at 7.30 p.m.** on that day. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin will lead a Service of Prayer inspired by the Gospel of the Presentation and the expectations for the year expressed by Pope Francis. Music will be led by members of the Dublin Diocesan Music Group.

Rite of Election 2016

The Rite of Election (for Catechumens) and the Call to Continuing Conversion (for Candidates already baptised who wish to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church) takes place as usual on the First Sunday of Lent, **14 February** - at **3.30 p.m.** in St Mary's Pro Cathedral. If your parish has someone who you deem to be ready for Christian Initiation or Reception at this year's Easter Vigil and have not yet submitted completed registration forms to the Diocesan Liturgy Resource Centre, please do so **immediately** – if not we cannot guarantee their inclusion in the Rite of Election. The registration forms can be printed off from the Downloads section of www.litmus.dublindiocese.ie. Otherwise, contact us at the Liturgy Resource Centre and we will post them out to you. Each parish could mark this significant occasion by including a song of hope in the liturgy. *A Future with Hope* (David Haas) from Emmanuel 2016 might be just the one.

Current Issues



New Mass Setting

Many people have visited Saint Mel's Cathedral in Longford which was restored and re-dedicated after the disastrous fire of Christmas 2009. The Diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnois commissioned John O'Keefe to compose the Mass of Saint Mel. It is now available from Father Turlough Baxter, St. Mary's Church, Athlone, Co. Westmeath. In the introduction to this Mass, John O'Keefe offers practical background information about its use which could be applied generally:

'In communities where these settings have already been successfully piloted, results were achieved through the initiative and encouragement of the local pastor, assisted by singers who learnt the material in advance, so that it could be gradually handed over to the congregation.'
