#### Parish Pilgrimage to Lourdes 2024

On the 5th September at 6am, 37 parishioners travelled to Lourdes as part of the annual Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage - over 1000 people in total including 130 leaving cert students from 29 schools in the diocese who travelled as helpers. We also had 7 assisted pilgrims from our parish here in St. Brigid's who were cared for in the Accueil Notre Dame for the entire time. The pilgrimage was led by Archbishop Dermot Farrell, and Auxiliary Bishop Paul Dempsey. Monsignor Eoin Thynne was our spiritual director.

Over the 5 days we participated in all the liturgies including Mass at the Grotto, Mass and Anointing of the Sick, the Eucharistic and Torchlight processions, a Penitential Service, Youth Mass and the Water gesture which replaces the immersion baths in recent times. We prayed the Stations of the Cross on the high and low stations.

The music at all the ceremonies was very uplifting. Some of our group participated in walking tours of the Sanctuary area and parts of the town associated with St. Bernadette. We prayed for all in our parish, delivered all your petitions to the Grotto, had Mass offered for your intentions and lit a parish candle on our last day. The days were busy, the weather changeable but we had time for a bit of relaxation and enjoyed an ice cream, a glass of wine and a sing song! We look forward now to Lourdes 2025! **Sunday**. This year Archbishop Farrell has asked us to focus on all the things we do

to make our parish a safe and welcoming place for children and vulnerable adults. The new child safeguarding policy for the Catholic Church in Ireland, is called A Safe and Welcoming Church. The reason for the new title is that we have come to a point where we recognise that safeguarding can no longer be seen as a response to a crisis, brought about by abuse within the Church and the failure of many Church authorities to adequately address this abuse. Now we understand safeguarding as deeply rooted in gospel values, scripture and church teaching. Further, we commit ourselves not just to the prevention of harm but to the promotion of good, to the creation of the material and spiritual conditions for children's full development, as described by Pope Francis.

The updated safeguarding statement is on the notice boards in the church and in the extension. It includes contact details for the Diocese Safeguarding and Protection Service. Our Parish Safeguarding Representative is Aileen Connelly and we thank her for her dedication and commitment to this role.


