### **October - Mission Month**

October is the month when we celebrate the Missionary Outreach of the Catholic

Church around the world. During this month, we ask for your prayers for missionaries working at home and abroad. On World Mission Sunday we ask Catholics to support this work by giving generously to the collection at Mass on World Mission Sunday 20th October. This year Pope Francis has chosen the theme 'Go and invite everyone to the banquet'. Mission, he said, is a tireless going out to all women and men, in order to invite them to encounter God.

Children's Day of Mission Prayer is celebrated on the second Friday of October each year, so 11th October this year. It's purpose is to enhance the prayer lives of children, encouraging them to pray for each other and for overseas missionaries on mission with children. This special day fosters and awareness of mission and the need to help and serve others. We encourage children to pray together, for each other, and for children living in poverty and fear. ## Saints in the Church's Calendar

Bank Holiday: Mass 11am only, no evening mass Our Lady of the Rosary – Monday 7th October. This memorial (originally Our Lady of Victories), commemorates the battle of Lepanto (7th Oct 1571), when a Christian fleet defeated the Turks. The victory was attributed by Pope Pius V to the recitation of the Holy Rosary. Today's Eucharistic Adoration Tue & Fri 10.30am-5pm # celebration urges all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, following the example of the BVM who was in a special manner associated with the incarnation, Passion and glorious Resurrection of the Son of God.

> St John Henry Newman, Priest –9th Oct. (1801-1890). Beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2010. His feast day is the anniversary of his reception into the Catholic Church on 9th Oct 1845. He has connections with Ireland through his project on the establishment of the Catholic University of Ireland. Invited to Ireland in 1850, he became Rector of the Catholic University of Ireland in 1854 until his resignation in 1858.

Saint Canice (or Kenneth), Abbot –Friday 11th Oct (c.525-600), one of the 'Twelve Apostles of Ireland', was born in Derry. He studied for a time at Glasnevin under Mobhi. A deep friendship developed between himself and Colmcille, with whom he worked for a time in Scotland, where he set up a number of churches. After a visit to Rome, he returned to Ireland and founded several monasteries, including Aghaboe in Co. Laois, but this was replaced centuries later by his church in Kilkennv.
