#### Saints in the Church's calendar:

- St. John Vianney- Tuesday 4th August. 1786-1859, had to contend with poverty, military service and his own intellectual shortcomings in order to become a priest. In 1817, he was sent to care for the people of Ars, a small, obscure French village. The marvellous gift of the unlearned priest for seeing into the depths of the soul brought the world to Ars. Patron of priests.
- St. Mary Major 5th August. The doctrine of Mary, Mother of God, was solemnly proclaimed at the Council of Ephesus (431), and afterwards Pope Sixtus III (432-440) erected a basilica at Rome on the Esquiline Hill in honour of the Holy Mother of God, later to be known as St. Mary Major. This is the oldest church in the west dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

#### The Transfiguration of the Lord - Wednesday 6th August.


The Transfiguration gives us a brief and fleeting glimpse of Jesus in all his glory. It is a taste of what is to come. It encourages us and challenges us in our daily lives. It reminds us that our lives are far more than what we see, hear and experience every day. It is not just a matter of getting through the day. Being a follower of Jesus is about living with meaning, purpose and hope. We may never experience anything as powerful as the Transfiguration. But every day in countless and seemingly small ways God does break into our world and our daily lives. Every time we experience a moment of peace, joy, reconciliation or forgiveness, God is with us
