



November Plenary Indulgences for the Holy Souls: Conditions

- 1. Church Indulgence; a plenary indulgence may be gained, one per day, by visiting a church or oratory and reciting one Apostles' Creed and one Our Father.
- 2. Cemetery Indulgence; a plenary indulgence may also be gained, one per day, by visiting a cemetery.

For each indulgence the obligations of receiving Communion and praying for the Pope's intentions must be fulfilled, but it is sufficient to go to Confession once for several indulgences.

Saints in the Church's Calendar

All Souls Day - 2nd November - The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed To remember our beloved dead in the presence of God is wholesome and it is natural to remember them in love and thanksgiving. We thank God for the gifts bestowed on us through them - signs of his grace and presence. We entrust our beloved to the love and mercy of God because, even though we do not grieve as those who have no hope (1Th 4:13), to remember the dead is holy and devout (2 Mac 12:45). All they have meant for us is not lost forever, for God is their life now and always.

All the Saints of Ireland - Thurs 6th Nov. Ireland, especially in the early Christian centuries, was known as an isle of saints and scholars. Many of these combined pastoral care with observance of the monastic life. The Irish also did much to bring the faith to other parts of Europe and further afield.
