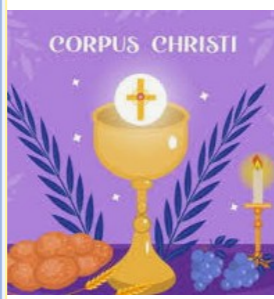
Parish Pilgrimage

St Vincent de Paul: Our outdoor monthly collection for St Brigid's will be taken up next weekend, 13th & 14th June, at both masses.



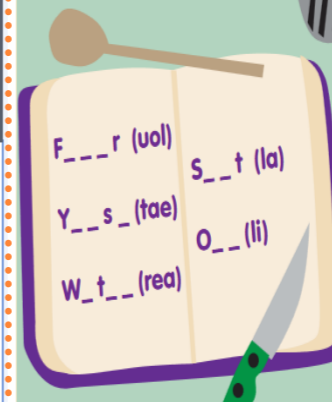

Jesus wants us to know how much he loves us. Jesus is the living bread. If we eat the living bread, we will share Jesus' life and love!

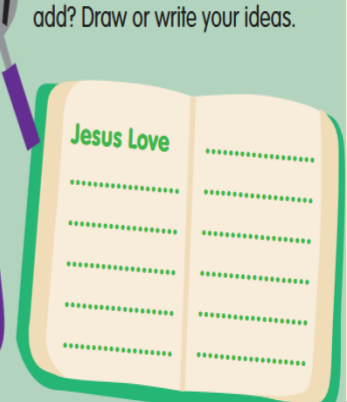
Recipe for bread

What do we need to make bread? Add the missing letters to find the ingredients.



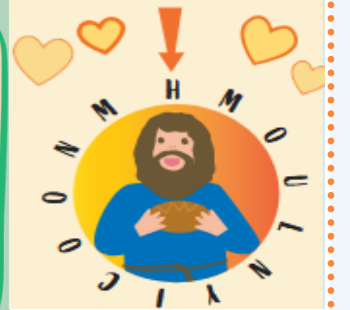
Recipe for life
